
Dear Sir:

Under the Immigration and Nationality Act which became law December 24, 1952 certain classes of aliens who were previously not amenable to any action by this Service became subject to deportation from the United States. It has come to our attention that a number of aliens who petitioned for United States citizenship during the period from 1935 to 1945 were denied citizenship on grounds which may now render them liable to deportation action.

In order that an appropriate investigation and review may be conducted in each of these cases to determine amenability of the subject to action by this Service, it is requested that you furnish this office, at your earliest possible convenience, a list setting forth the name, petition number, and reason for denial in the case of each person whose petition for citizenship was denied in your Court during the period from January 1, 1935 to December 31, 1945.

Your cooperation and early attention to this matter will be greatly appreciated.

Dear Mr. Ritter:

We refer to your letter of April 19, 1963 regarding
passport application for Anne Thona Kopiles.

A search of our files failed to reveal records of any
previous passport issued in Mrs. Kopiles's name. The in-
formation you have given us, however, appears that Mrs.
Kopiles must have left her United States citizenship by her
marriage to a Czechoslovakian national. According to the
law, a woman who married before September 27, 1922, loses the
nationality of her husband.

We suggest that you ascertain from Mrs. Kopiles the
exact date of her marriage. If she was married before Sep-
tember 22, 1922, please ask her to write or call the nearest
Office of the Immigration and Naturalization Service in in-
formation on how she may reacquire citizenship. In this case,
she should apply for a passport only after she has regained
citizenship.

In the event that she was married after September
1922, she may apply for a passport immediately. Please have
her submit her marriage certificate plus acceptable evidence
of her birth in the United States.
